We've Broken Ground!

I'm following the path God's laid before me.

When Rocky came to the Mission with a meth addiction nine years ago, he found much more than sobriety. He found a relationship with the Lord that would change the course of his life. **"Through the program, the Lord delivered me from addiction and I started living fully for Jesus,"** he says.

He graduated from our program and became a small group leader at a church but, when he felt the Lord calling him to become a children's pastor, he refused. **"I didn't think I was prepared, so I ran away from God's call,"** he says. "For seven years, I got distracted by living everyday life, working jobs here and there."

Then Rocky lost his job and his apartment and he realized he couldn't run from God's call anymore. "The Lord broke me down and said, 'I have plans for you and I'm ready to show you,'" he says. "Then he led me back to the Mission to go through the program again."

By the time Rocky returned, our New Beginnings

life-change program incorporated a Bible study on selfconfrontation. "It was exactly what I needed," he says. "I realized I'd been holding bitterness toward other people and myself, and I needed to ask forgiveness for the hurt I'd caused in the past."

He found freedom and healing when he addressed the issues that arose. **"The Lord did amazing things in my life through the program,"** he says. "I'm much more joyful."

Rocky graduated and is now earning his bachelor's degree in pastoral ministry at Barclay College. "I see what the Lord has for me and I'm following the path He's laid before me," he says. "The Mission has given me the tools I need to live my life to please the Lord."

We've Broken Ground! Eagles Wing is Underway!

Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. – Isaiah 40:31

Union Rescue Mission broke ground May 8 on our new Eagles Wing transitional housing project!

Graduates of our discipleship and recovery programs are now one step closer to having a new place to call home as they move from life at the Mission to sustainable, productive, independent living.

Eagles Wing's 24-units on our six-acre campus on North Hillside will give graduates who are in transition the time, space, and support they need. In addition to one-bedroom and studio units, the facility will also house administrative offices and a community room that will double as a storm shelter.

"Eagles Wing will provide a bridge as our graduates transition from homelessness to contributing roles in our community," says Denny Bender, the Mission's Executive Director.

We've raised most all the cost to complete construction, but we need help furnishing the individual residences (approximately \$5,000 each). Will you consider a gift toward one of the 24 units?
