Rocky was running from God's call on his life. "The Lord had delivered me from addiction at the Mission and I felt He wanted me to be a youth pastor," he says. "But I didn't believe I was prepared, so I ran for seven years, getting distracted by work and everyday life."

Then Rocky lost his job and his apartment and he stopped running. "I realized that God was breaking me down because He had something else for me. That's when He led me back to the Mission," he says.

Rocky entered our New Beginnings life-change program, and through our Self-Confrontation course, he discovered the issues that had kept him on the run. "I had bitterness toward a lot of people and myself," he says. "And I'd been afraid to ask for forgiveness from the people I'd hurt in the past."

Bible studies, chapel services and Christian counseling helped Rocky release his bitterness and gave him the courage to seek forgiveness. Now his relationships with his son, his parents and others closest to him have been restored. "It was exactly what I needed," he says.

Rocky completed the program and is now living in the dorms at Barclay College in Haviland, where he's earning a degree in Youth Ministry. He's engaged to be married and looking forward to spending his life in ministry. "Now I'm following the path God has laid out for me. I'm working to please Him and the joy I have is amazing," he says.

Samaritan Center: Back to Where It All Began

Union Rescue Mission is excited to announce we're expanding our services with our new Samaritan Center. We're returning to our roots, providing hope for our hungry and homeless neighbors in the heart of Wichita.

We've acquired a building at 334 N. Topeka, which will open as a downtown shelter for homeless men currently on the streets. At capacity, the facility will sleep 200+ guests each night, providing them



with wholesome meals and other life essentials. While in our care, men will have access to vital community resources and the opportunity to move into the long-term programs at our Hillside location. For many, the new shelter will offer entry into the process of recovery, regeneration, restoration and re-engagement for those ready to start a new life.
